I wanted to remind you that the rate increase was effective October 1st. This means that the bill that you will receive in November 2022 will have this increase. If you have any questions about your bill, please give us a call.

In October, you should have received a capital credit allocation notice. This notice was for the calendar year 2021 operating margins and allocating them to each member's account. We have had several questions about the amount, and it is not the amount that will come to you in a capital credit check. Those checks are not figured until the following year and based upon the amount of monies that the board of directors approve to retire. Again, any questions, let me know.

November 11th is Veteran's Day. Please thank a veteran for their service in defending our great nation. Without our veterans, past and present, we would not be able to enjoy our freedom that we have. Thank you to all Veterans!
