The Platte County School District#1 recently received a rebate check for over \$8,100 from Tri-State Generation and Transmission and Wheatland REA for the installation of an electric thermal storage system at the Chugwater High School! School Board Chairman, Greg Meyer, accepted the rebate from Lee Boughey, Tri-State Senior Manager of Communications and Public Relations, and Robert Brockman, Wheatland REA Board President. The installation of this equipment will save both the school district and REA members a significant amount of energy and therefore money during its lifetime. A similar system, at the Chugwater Grade School, has shown a savings of \$25,000 per year over its previous system!
