From the office of RKA...

November 2021...can you believe it? It seems like we were just looking forward to jumping out of year 2020 and into 2021. Now here we are getting ready for another new year! Time is rollin'...

As we move closer to the end of 2021, it seems that momentum is picking up here at the co-op. Year-end requires us to complete next year's budget, closing of the books, and to try to complete as many capital projects as possible that affect the current year's margins and projections. As the supposed "financial wizard" here, I am always monitoring expenses vs. revenues for the current month, year to date and projecting for



the next year. In looking at YTD figures, we have currently sold 2,167,762 or 2.0% Kwh's more than last year. This tells me that we remain strong in our revenues and all classes are ahead of last year's except for seasonal (-2.0%) and irrigation (-4.1%). These totals are as of month end September 2021, so we will see what October brings us when we close the month.

With all that "math" thrown at you; it remains a good estimate on what 2022 has in store for us. In the past, I have mentioned that revenues are difficult to predict as Mother Nature, the economy, politics are just a few factors that play into it. For next year, not only revenues will be difficult but also expenses. As you are aware, the materials/supply chain around the nation is somewhat a cluster right now. Unfortunately, it didn't leave us out of the picture. Some supplies that we would order in the past that took weeks to get are now taking months. Along with the difficulty of getting the supplies is also now the cost. Materials that are crucial in running our co-op are being ordered immediately only because tomorrow they might not be available. Once again, my crystal ball is a little clouded and not much help at this point. Stay tuned...

It doesn't seem possible, but it is now time to start talking about an annual meeting for 2022! Currently, we are tentatively scheduled for one of the Wednesdays in March 2022. We will also be going back to the Agriplex building for a meeting and luncheon. With the approval from the Board of Directors, we will be also having the Wellness Fair. There is also one director position – Director at Large, that will be up for election. Please keep watching for further information!

November 11th is Veterans Day. Please thank a veteran for their service to defend our great nation. We will be having our Veterans Day Open House on November 11th at the Agriplex building. This special event has grown so much that we now need a bigger place to hold the event. Please come by and enjoy all the veterans' memorabilia that will be on display.

Fall is my favorite time of the year. But once again, as I write this article, I am watching rain that is becoming snow already early in the season. Mother Nature is showing her attitude again!! LOL! We are still doing some fishing as the motto at our house is you fish until ice on and start again when ice is off. The dogs are
